S.S. LURLINE: -- Rudolph ASPLUND, chief radio officer. Man named Rudolf Phillip ASPLUND listed as communistic radio operator in the Merchant Marine Suspect list of O.N.I.

(2) Frank A. STUBBE, 2nd asst. radio officer. Man named F. A. STUBBS listed as Communistic radio operator. by direction.

(3) Harold E. JOHNSON, 3rd asst. radio officer. Man named H. E. JOHNSON, listed as Communistic radio operator.

(4) John S. HUNTER, A.B. Man named J. S. HUNTER listed as Communist in Merchant Marine. Barred from American-Hawaiian Line.

(5) Herbert N. MARTIN, cadet. Man named Herbert MARTIN listed as radical seaman.

(6) Charles E. THICKSTON, 1st electrician. Man of same name discharged as electrician at Wake for insubordination and poor work.

(7) Emil A. GERZ, chief steward. Identification positive. Records show he had Nazi books in his cabin. Said to be pro-Hitler.

(8) Paul J. BOYLES, yeoman. Identification positive. Active Communist.

(9) Kijald T. MOE, porter, Man named K. MOE listed as agitator and anti-American.

(10) Svend A. JENSEN, porter. Svend Aagaar JENSEN reported Nazi waiter on SS WASHINGTON, 1940.

(11) Carl STEFAN, waiter. Identification positive. Suspected of being Nazi. German born. Pro-Axis clippings in his locker. Considered dangerous.

(12) Chester C. BAKER, Messman. Identification positive. Reported to be Communist.

(13) Albert LANKIN, messman. Man named Al LANKIN distributed Communist literature in Honolulu.

(14) Donald M. WOLLAM, janitor. Identification positive. Suspected of being Communist.
