1. The MICHIGAN French steamship.

was inspected this date and the following armament was found on board:

GUNS: 2 guns of 90 M/MS. located on afterdeck house. port & starboard sides.
Port gun, Mounting, Society of Construction of Batijnolles, dated 30 Aug.1916.
Barrel, Bourges # 5205 dated 1893, telescopic sight, 36°42' elevation, 340°
to 180° training (to port). Starboard gun, Mounting, Society of Construction
of Batijnolles, dated 10 July, 1918. Barrel, Bourges # 3220 dated 1880,
telescopic sight, 36°42' elevation, 20° to 180° training (to starboard).

AMMUNITION: 100 rounds of service, 23 rounds training, 120 quick matches for
shells. Ammunition stored in steel locker on deck house equipped for flooding,
ready racks also installed.

SMALL ARMS: 1 machine gun, 2 rifles, 5 revolvers.

AMMUNITION: 1145 rounds machine gun, 240 rounds rifle and 103 rounds revolver.


MAGAZINE: 19 bands for machine 25 rds each.

FIRE CONTROL AND COMMUNICATION EQUIPMENT: None.

GUNS CREWS: 5 men (both guns included).

REMARKS: 60 gas mask. 6 smoke apparatus, no magnetic mine protective device
and Etc.
