1. DIO Dispatch No. 261545 dated 26 October, 1944, stated as follows:

LEE ROY GASKIN, JR. 3RD ASST. ENGR. ABOARD SS HENRY S SANFORD: BORN GEORGIA: AGE 28, 6, BROWN HAIR, FAIR COMPLEXION X SUBJECT WROTE LETTER TO HIS WIFE, MRS. L. R. GASKIN, JR. 2068 BUCKMAN ST., JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA, IN WHICH HE REVEALED INFORMATION CONCERNING NATURE CARGO, PORTS OF CALL, LENGTH OF TRIP, PROBABLE DESTINATION X ALSO GAVE ADDITIONAL NAME TO BE ADDED TO CODE TO DETERMINE WHEREABOUTS X SUBJECT SHOULD BE WARNED ABOUT DANGERS OF VIOLATION CENSORSHIP REGULATIONS X

2. Lee Roy GASKIN, Jr., Z-118813, 28, 3rd Assistant Engineer aboard the SS FEINSTONE is apparently the same man mentioned in above dispatch. GASKIN readily admitted writing his wife, Mrs. L. R. GASKIN, Jr., at 2068 Buckman Street, Jacksonville, Florida, while he was 3rd Assistant Engineer aboard SS HENRY S. SANFORD. He stated, however, that he had no knowledge of ever having violated censorship regulations in any letters written to his wife, while aboard this ship. SUBJECT was fully warned about dangers of violating censorship regulations.
