1. In accordance with request contained in Reference (a), we are quoting below excerpt of letter received today from Captain of the Port, Key West, Florida, in response to our recent letter regarding the American tanker OKLAHOMA:

"The S. S. OKLAHOMA mentioned in first paragraph of reference (a) departed Miami, Fla. on 26 April, 1942 at 21:55 for Puerto Padre, Cuba. Headquarters was advised of this movement by dispatch."

2. From the foregoing, it is evident the vessel previously reported by Key West is not the same vessel as reported towed to Brunswick, Ga., from scene of wreck, date of arrival being 22 April. In accordance with the above information, we are today showing the departure of the SS OKLAHOMA from Key West on subject report in accordance with the quotation contained in this letter.
