Departed Smith's Bluff, Tex., 21 June, 1942, for Port Joe, Fla.

Torpedoed 22 June, 1942, 2300 CWT; 28°53 N.- 89°15 W.

Weather, clear; sea, slight.

On board, 33; saved, 0.

Vessel: total loss.

This tanker, carrying gasoline, burst into flames immediately upon being hit, presumably by a torpedo, not far off Southwest Pass, La. So far as is known, no boats got away from the ship, and she went down in 9 minutes with no known survivors, according to the eye-witness account of a friendly ship in the vicinity.
