N.B. - On 3/5/43 ship was torpedoed in #1 hold starboard side while in convoy. Torpedo passed right through ship. Ship went down by the head but didn't sink. It stayed with convoy for 2 days and then fell off due to rough weather. At this attack several deck cracks occurred especially in way of #3 hatch.

N.B. - Several survivors thought molives would have been saved had master abandoned after first hit of second attack. Due to roughness of sea, master thought it safer to remain aboard stricken ship than to chance lifeboats.
